AUSTRALIAN MUSEUM (AMEND-MENT) ACT.

Act No. 39, 1931.

An Act to make certain provisions relating to officers and servants of the Australian Museum; to amend the Australian Museum Act, 1902, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 2nd October, 1931.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, No. 39, 9131. by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Australian Short title Museum (Amendment) Act, 1931," and shall be read and commented with the Australian Museum Act, 1902.
- (2) This Act shall commence upon a date to be appointed by the Governor and notified by proclamation published in the Gazette.
- 2. (1) The Australian Museum Act, 1902, is Amendment of amended—
 - (a) by inserting next after section seven the fol-New 8. 74. lowing new section:—
 - 7A. (1) The Governor may appoint such Appointment officers and servants of the said museum as he of officers and servants, may deem necessary.
 - (2) Such officers and servants shall be appointed under and be subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1902, as amended by subsequent Acts.
 - (b) by omitting from section eight the words sec. s. "may appoint all officers and servants of the (Managesaid museum and shall" and by inserting in ment.) lieu thereof the words "shall subject to this Act and to the by-laws made thereunder";
 - (c) by omitting subsections two and three of Sec. 9. section nine and by inserting in lieu thereof (Correction.) the following subsections:—
 - (2) The by-laws, rules, and orders shall—
 - (a) be submitted to the Governor for his approval;
 - (b) when approved by the Governor, be published in the Gazette;
 - (c) take effect from the date of such publication or from a later date to be specified in the by-laws, rules, or orders; and

- (d) be laid before both Houses of Parliament within fourteen sitting days after the publication thereof if Parliament is then in session, and if not, then within fourteen sitting days after the commencement of the next session.
- (3) If either House of Parliament passes a resolution of which notice has been given at any time within fifteen sitting days after such by-laws, rules, or orders have been laid before such House disallowing any by-law, rule, or order or part thereof, such by-law, rule, or order or part thereof shall thereupon cease to have effect.

Existing officers to be subject to Public Service Act, 1902.

(2) All officers and servants appointed under the Australian Museum Act, 1902, before the commencement of this Act, and holding office immediately before such commencement, shall continue to hold such office in all respects as if they had been appointed under section 7A of the Australian Museum Act, 1902, as inserted by paragraph (a) of subsection one of this section, and shall during their continuance in such office be subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1902, as amended by subsequent Acts.
