

QUEEN VICTORIA BUILDING SITE ACT.

An Act to make certain provision in relation to the tenure by the Council of the City of Sydney of part of the site of the Queen Victoria Building; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 21st October, 1952.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Queen Victoria Building Site Act, 1952."

2. The Crown Grant dated the fourth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and enrolled in the Registrar-General's Office in the Register of Grants Serial Number 197, pages 327, 328 and 329, on the thirteenth

thirteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, whereby certain land was granted by the Crown to the Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors of the City of Sydney and their Successors for ever for the following purpose, namely, as a site and place for a general market for the use and convenience of the inhabitants of that City, shall have and be deemed always to have had effect as if the purpose for which the land was intended and granted, the conditions relating to the setting apart, maintenance and user of the land, and the right of re-entry exercisable upon the happening of certain events had not been inserted in the Crown Grant. **No. 30, 1952.**
