Act No. 27, 1974.

An Act to enable the Public Trustee to transfer certain lands to the occupiers thereof and to sell certain other lands; for these and other purposes to amend the Voluntary Workers (Soldiers' Holdings) Act, 1917, and the Conveyancing Act, 1919; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 17th April, 1974.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title. 1. This Act may be cited as the "Voluntary Workers (Soldiers' Holdings) Amendment Act, 1974".

Amendment of Act No. 25, 1917. The Voluntary Workers (Soldiers' Holdings) Act, 25, 1917.

Sec. 7. (Conveyance to soldier or dependent.)

- (a) (i) by inserting in section 7 (1) after the word "association" where firstly occurring the words "or, where the Public Trustee is satisfied that the association has disbanded or ceased to function, at the request of the Minister";
 - (ii) by inserting in section 7 (1) after the word "association" where secondly occurring the words ", or by the Minister, when making the request,";
 - (iii) by inserting at the end of section 7 the following subsection:—
 - (4) Neither the Registrar-General nor any other person registering or certifying or investigating title shall be concerned to inquire, in relation to any land expressed to be transferred by the Public Trustee pursuant to this section—
 - (a) whether any request was made under subsection (1); or
 - (b) whether the person to whom the land was transferred was the person named under that subsection.

Sec. 8. (Property to be exempt from insolvency or bankruptcy laws.)

3. The Voluntary Workers (Soldiers' Holdings) Act, Further 1917, is further amended—

4. (1) The Public Trustee may enter into, and may Public give effect to, an agreement approved by the Governor for Trustee may sell the sale to The Housing Commission of New South Wales land described in of the land described in Schedule 1.

Schedule 1.

- (2) An agreement referred to in subsection (1) may contain such terms and conditions as the Governor thinks fit including, without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, terms and conditions for or with respect to-
 - (a) the continuation for the time being of any existing occupancy of the land to which the agreement relates;

- (b) the provision of alternative accommodation for a person occupying that land; and
- (c) the dedication of any part of that land as a public reserve.

Public sell land described in Schedule 2.

- 5. (1) The Public Trustee may enter into, and may give Trustee may effect to, an agreement approved by the Governor for the sale of the land described in Schedule 2.
 - (2) The regulations made under the Public Trustee Act, 1913, apply to and in respect of a sale made under subsection (1).

Restriction on powers of Public Trustee.

6. The land described in Schedules 1 and 2 shall not be disposed of by the Public Trustee, except as provided by this Act.

Disposal of proceeds of ŝale.

The proceeds of a sale pursuant to section 4 or 5 shall be applied by the Public Trustee in such manner as the Governor may direct.

Exoneration from inquiry.

- 8. (1) Neither the Registrar-General nor any other person registering or certifying or investigating title shall be concerned to inquire whether a transfer by the Public Trustee of any land within the land described in Schedule 1 or 2 has been executed in conformity with the powers conferred by this Act.
- (2) Land sold under this Act is so sold freed and discharged from any trust or condition affecting the land immediately before the commencement of this Act.

9. (1) The Conveyancing Act, 1919, is amended by No. 27, 1974 omitting section 167.
