Act No. 11, 1979.

An Act to compensate certain former members of the Legislative Council for loss of anticipated parliamentary remuneration and pension. [Assented to, 18th April, 1979.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

- 1. This Act may be cited as the "Constitution (Legislative Short Council Compensation) Act, 1979".

4. Any payment to which any person is entitled under section Payments 2 or 3, or any part of any such payment, not drawn by him or to be drawn on his behalf within 3 months after the date of assent to this Act within shall revert to the Treasury and become part of the Consolidated 3 months. Revenue Fund.

Compensation payable in case of death. 5. Where a person who is entitled to any payment under section 2 or 3 dies before that payment is made, the legal personal representative of that person is entitled to be paid the amount of that payment.

Appropriation of Consolidated Revenue Fund.

6. All payments under this Act are payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund which, to the necessary extent, is appropriated accordingly.

No other compensation payable. 7. Except as provided in this Act, a person who ceased to be a member of the Legislative Council by reason of the operation of section 17 (1) of the Constitution Act, 1902, is not entitled to any payment by way of compensation for loss of anticipated parliamentary remuneration, for loss of anticipated parliamentary pension or for any other loss arising from his so ceasing to be a member of the Legislative Council.
