### MINES RESCUE ACT 1994—REGULATION\*

(Relating to contributions to the Mines Rescue Board)

NEW SOUTH WALES



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HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the Mines Rescue Act 1994, has been pleased to make the Regulation set forth hereunder.

## Citation

1. This Regulation may be cited as the Mines Rescue Regulation 1996.

#### Commencement

**2.** This Regulation commences on 29 March 1996.

## **Definition**

**3.** In this Regulation:

"the Act" means the Mines Rescue Act 1984.

### Contribution to Mines Rescue Board

**4.** The contribution payable to the Mines Rescue Board under section 31 of the Act by the owner of a coal mine specified in Column 1 of Schedule 1 in respect of the financial year of the Board beginning on 1 July 1995 and ending on 30 June 1996 is the amount specified in Column 2 of that Schedule.

<sup>\*</sup> The regulation (statutory rule) appointed 29 March 1996 as the date of its commencement. Pursuant to section 39 (2A) of the Interpretation Act 1987, the regulation is not invalid merely because the regulation was published in the Gazette after the day on which one or more of its provisions is or are expressed to take effect, but provides, in that case. for that or those provisions to take effect from the day on which the regulation is published in the Gazette, instead of from the earlier day.

# Repeal

**5.** The Mines Rescue (Transitional) Regulation 1995 is repealed.

#### **NOTES**

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### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Section 31 of the Mines Rescue Act 1994 requires the owner of a coal mine, in respect of each financial year of the Mines Rescue Board, to pay to towards the cost of meeting the expenses incurred by the Board in exercising its principal functions a contribution of such amount as is prescribed by the regulations.

The object of this Regulation is to prescribe the amount of the contribution payable for each coal mine in respect of the 1995/1996 financial year of the Board. Section 31 (2) of the Mines Rescue Act 1994 requires the amount prescribed to be certified by the Minister as appropriate for the coal mine concerned, having regard to such of the matters set out in that subsection as are applicable to the mine. Those matters include, for example, the average number of employees employed at the mine during the period of 12 months preceding the financial year concerned, the quantity of coal produced from the mine during that period and the cost incurred during that period in meeting the expense of having members of the Board's staff on stand-by in respect of the mine.

This Regulation also repeals the Mines Rescue (Transitional) Regulation 1995, which prescribed the relevant contributions for the 6-month period from 1 January 1995 to 30 June 1995 following the changeover from the calendar year to financial year basis of payment.

This Regulation comprises matters of a machinery nature.

This Regulation is made under the Mines Rescue Act 1994 and, in particular, under sections 31 (Owners of coal mines to make contributions to the Fund for principal functions of Board) and 50 (the general regulation-making power).
