Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to prescribe the laboratory to which blood samples taken under the *Marine (Boating Safety—Alcohol and Drugs) Act 1991* are to be submitted for analysis.

This Regulation is made under the *Marine (Boating Safety—Alcohol and Drugs) Act 1991* (as amended by the *Road Transport (Safety and Traffic Management) Amendment (Blood Sampling) Act 2000*), in particular under sections 13, 16A and 34 (the general regulation-making power).

This Regulation contains matter of a machinery nature.

1 Name of Regulation
