

## No. VI.

An Act to suspend for a limited time so much of <sup>LICENSED PUBLICANS.</sup>  
an Act intituled “*An Act to regulate the  
granting of Licenses for the Sale of Spirits  
Ale Beer and other Liquors in New South  
Wales and Van Diemen’s Land respectively*” as  
requires the Certificate therein-mentioned to  
be signed by a Minister of the Church of  
England. [15th February, 1825.]

WHEREAS by a certain Law or Ordinance made and passed by <sup>Preamble.</sup>  
His Excellency the Governor with the advice of the Council  
intituled “*An Act to regulate the granting of Licenses for the Sale of  
Spirits Ale Beer and other Liquors in New South Wales and Van  
Diemen’s Land respectively*” it is amongst other things provided that  
no certificate as therein is mentioned shall be granted before the  
applicant for the same shall produce to the Justices therein mentioned  
a certificate signed by the Minister of the Church of England And  
whereas inconveniences have been felt in carrying the said provisions  
into

into effect for remedy whereof be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice of the Council that it shall be lawful for the Justices assembled as in the said Act is mentioned until the Licensing Day next ensuing this Act to grant a certificate according to the effect of the form marked Appendix (B) annexed to the said Law or Ordinance although the certificate produced to such Justices according to the effect of the form marked Appendix (C) may not be signed by any Minister of the Church of England any thing in the said Law or Ordinance contained to the contrary notwithstanding.
