An Act for applying the Amount collected on ^{LICENSED PUBLICANS.} the Issue of Licenses to Retail fermented and spirituous Liquors in the Year One Thousand eight hundred and thirty-three towards defraying the Expenses of the Police Establishment of New South Wales during the same Year. [22nd August, 1833.]

WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth intituled "An Act to provide for the Administration of Justice in New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land and for the more effectual Government thereof and for other purposes relating thereto" it was among other things enacted That all and every the powers and authorities vested by certain other Acts of Parliament therein referred to or either of them in the Governor of New South Wales or the person administering the Government thereof should thenceforth be vested in and exercised by the said Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony and that the produce of the several duties imposed and made payable under and by virtue of the said Acts therein referred to and also under and by virtue of that Act should be applied in such manner and to such purposes as the said Governor and Council should from time to time by any Law or Ordinance appoint And whereas by a certain Act of the Governor and Council of New South Wales passed in the third year of the reign of His present Majesty King William the Fourth intituled "An Act for licensing Public-houses and for regulating the retail of fermented and spirituous Liquors in New South Wales" it was enacted That all sums of money collected levied or received under and by virtue of the said Act after deducting such part of the forfeitures fines and penalties as are ordered to be paid to the persons informing and suing for the same should be paid into the hands of the Colonial Treasurer and be appropriated to the use of His Majesty His Heirs and Successors for the public uses of the said Colony and the support of the Government thereof And whereas it is expedient to appropriate the amount collected in pursuance of the provisions of the said last recited Act on the issue of licenses to retail fermented and spirituous liquors in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three towards defraying the expenses of the Police Establishment of the said Colony during the said year Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof That out of the produce of the said licenses there shall be issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding nine thousand and thirty-seven pounds ten shillings towards defraying the expenses of the Police Establishment of the said Colony for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three.

2. And be it further enacted That the Treasurer of the said Colony shall issue and pay the said sum or sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time-being by any warrant or order in writing shall from time to time order and direct and that the payments so to be made by him shall be charged upon and payable out of the Revenues of the said Colony.

And be it further enacted That the said Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid and that the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum or sums of money as shall be therein mentioned and that he shall and do receive credit for the same accordingly.
