An Act to make perpetual an Act intituled “*An SCAB IN SHEEP ACT

“*Act for preventing the extension of the infectious

WHEREAS an Act was passed by the Governor and Council of Preamble.
New South Wales in the third year of the reign of His present
Majesty King William the Fourth intituled “*An Act for preventing 3 Gul. IV. No. 5.
the extension of the infectious Disease commonly called the Scab in
Sheep or Lambs in the Colony of New South Wales*” and will expire
on the first day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and
thirty-five. And whereas the said Act has been found beneficial in
preventing the communication and extension of the said Disease and
it is expedient that the same should be made perpetual. Be it therefore Made perpetual.
enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the
advice of the Legislative Council thereof That the said recited Act
passed in the third year of the reign of His said Majesty shall be and
the same is hereby made perpetual.
