SUPREME COURT
POWERS DEFINITION.

An Act to remove doubts respecting the power of the Supreme Court of New South Wales to do and perform certain acts which are required to be done and performed by His Majesty's Courts in England. [9th October, 1835.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to remove doubts respecting the power of the Supreme Court of New South Wales to do and perform certain acts matters and things which may be done by His Majesty's Courts in England Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof That where any Act of Parliament in force in England on the first day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine and applicable to the said Colony or any Act of Parliament adopted and directed to be applied in the said Colony shall authorize and direct any proceeding act matter or thing to be had done performed or executed by or before His Majesty's Courts at Westminster or the respective Judges thereof in the administration of justice every such proceeding act matter and thing shall be and the same is hereby authorized and directed to be had done executed and performed by the Supreme Court of New South Wales and the respective Judges thereof in like manner as if the same had been in and by such Act of Parliament expressly authorized and directed to be had done executed and performed by the said Supreme Court of New South Wales or the respective Judges of the said Court.
