SHEEP MORTGAGES. An Act to declare the power of Mortgagors of Sheep. [17th June, 1848.]

Preamble.

11 Vic. No. 4.

Not lawful for mortgagors of sheep to grant a lien on their wool.

WHEREAS doubts have arisen whether mortgagors of sheep under an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "*An Act to repeal an Act intituled 'An Act to give a preferable Lien on Wool from season to season and to make Mortgages of Sheep Cattle and Horses valid without delivery to the Mortgagee and to substitute for a limited time other provisions in lieu thereof'*" after mortgages duly executed can grant valid liens on the wool thereof and it is expedient to remove those doubts Be it declared and enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof That it shall not be lawful for any mortgagor of sheep so long as any mortgage thereon executed by him shall remain unsatisfied to grant a lien on the wool of such sheep any practice to the contrary notwithstanding.
