WHEREAS it has been found injurious to the interests of trade Preamble.
that the provisions of the Act sixteenth Victoria number twenty-three should be enforced in certain towns and places And whereas there is now no power given by law to restrain the enforcing of the same when inexpedient Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative

Appropriation (1860-1).

Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. The Governor with the advice of the Executive Council may on the receipt of a petition signed by not fewer than twenty householders resident at any town or place where the Act sixteenth Victoria number twenty-three has been already declared to apply praying that the said Act may be declared no longer applicable to such town or place cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Gazette* and unless a counter petition signed by a greater number of householders resident as aforesaid be received by the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication the Governor with the advice aforesaid may by Proclamation published in like manner declare the said Act no longer applicable to such town or place and the same shall thereupon be no longer applicable accordingly.
