DG AND GOAT.

An Act to prohibit the use of Dogs or Goats for the purposes of draught. [7th April, 1866.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to prohibit the use of Dogs or Goats for the purposes of draught Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

Dogs or Goats
drawing carts &c.
prohibited.

1. After the passing of this Act every person who shall use any Dog or Goat for the purpose of drawing or helping to draw any cart carriage truck or barrow shall be liable to a penalty not more than forty shillings for the first offence and not more than five pounds for the second or any following offence.

Recovery of
penalties.

2. Every penalty for any offence against this Act may be enforced and recovered upon summary conviction of such offence before any Justice of the Peace and in case of non-payment thereof it shall be levied by distress and sale of the offender's goods and chattels and on failure of distress shall be enforced in manner provided by the Act eleventh and twelfth Victoria chapter forty-three as adopted by the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council fourteenth Victoria number forty-three and by any Acts amending the same.

Title.

3. This Act shall be styled and cited as the "Dog and Goat Act of 1866."
