DISEASES IN SHEEP  
ACT AMENDMENT.

An Act to amend the “ Diseases in Sheep Act  
of 1866.” [1st July, 1876.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Act thirty Victoria number sixteen being the “ Sheep Act of 1866 ” Be it therefore enacted by the Queen’s Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the “ Diseases in Sheep Act Amendment Act of 1876 ” and shall be read as forming part of the “ Sheep Act of 1866.”

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the “ Sheep Act of 1866 ” the Governor in Council may from time to time by proclamation in the *Gazette* suspend for any period not exceeding six months such of the provisions of the said Act relating to the introduction of imported sheep from neighbouring Colonies as will admit of fat sheep arriving by sea from any Colony in which disease is not known nor suspected to exist being taken direct by water to the Abattoirs on Glebe Island in Port Jackson for slaughter under such regulations as may be set forth in the said proclamation.
