An Act to continue the “Vine Diseases Act of 1886,” and the “Vine Diseases Act Amendment Act of 1888,” for a further period of one year. [22nd December, 1891.]

DISEASES ACTS
FURTHER
CONTINUATION.

WHEREAS the “Vine Diseases Act of 1886,” as amended by the Preamble.
“Vine Diseases Act Amendment Act of 1888,” will shortly expire, and it is expedient to continue the said Acts for a further period of one year: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen’s Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The “Vine Diseases Act of 1886,” being the Act of the
fiftieth Victoria number twenty-three, and the “Vine Diseases Act
Amendment Act of 1888,” being the Act of the fifty-second Victoria,
number one, which Acts were continued for a period of one year by
the “Vine Diseases Acts Continuation Act of 1889,” and for a further
period of one year by the “Vine Diseases Acts Further Continuation
Act, 1890,” shall and they are hereby declared to remain and continue
in force up to and inclusive of the first day of January, in the year one
thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, but no longer.

2. This Act may be cited as the “Vine Diseases Acts Further Short title.
Continuation Act, 1891.”
