An Act to amend the Stamp Duties Act, 1898.
[19th November, 1900.]STAMP DUTIES
AMENDMENT.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. From and after the commencement of this Act postage stamps Postage stamps not shall not be used for denoting the payment of duty under the provisions ^{to be used.} of the Stamp Duties Act, 1898.
2. The Governor may by notice in the Gazette prescribe what Governor to declare forms of adhesive stamps may be used for the purpose of denoting the ^{what stamps may be used.} payment of duty under the provisions of the said Act.
3. So much of section three of the said Act as includes postage Repeal. stamp in the definition of "stamp" is hereby repealed.
4. This Act may be cited as the "Stamp Duties Amendment Act, ^{Short title.} 1900," and shall be read as one with and forming part of the Stamp Duties Act, 1898.
5. This Act shall come into operation on the first day of January, Commencement. one thousand nine hundred and one.
