

Act No. 52, 1901.

An Act to enable the Committee of the Maitland Hospital to apply certain moneys for the purpose of the erection and furnishing of a new hospital. [26th November, 1901.]

MAITLAND HOSPITAL
ENABLING.

WHEREAS it has been resolved by the committee of the Maitland Hospital that it is desirable to erect and furnish a new hospital in place of the present one, and it is deemed necessary to obtain legislative authority to apply the funds of the hospital for that purpose: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Maitland Hospital Enabling Act, 1901." Short title.

2. The committee of the Maitland Hospital may with the consent of the trustees of the said hospital or a majority thereof in their absolute discretion, at any time, resort to any of the investments of the hospital mentioned in section eighteen of the Public Hospitals Act, 1898, and sell the same for the purpose of applying and may apply the moneys to arise from any such sale, and any moneys in their hands or in the hands of the said trustees for the purpose of the erection and furnishing of a new hospital in place of the present one: Provided that the sums so obtained and applied shall not exceed four thousand pounds.

Committee may apply moneys and proceeds of sale of investments towards new hospital.
