MAITLAND
CATTLE-DRIVING.

An Act to consolidate the enactments relating to the regulation of cattle-driving through the towns of East and West Maitland. [4th September, 1902]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Maitland Cattle-driving Act, 1902."

Repeal and saving.

2. (1) The Act forty-three Victoria number twenty is hereby repealed.

(2) All by-laws made under the authority of the Act hereby repealed and in force at the time of the passing of this Act shall be deemed to have been made hereunder.

Interpretation.

3. In this Act, unless the context or subject-matter otherwise indicates or requires,—

"cattle" includes bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, and steers.

4. Nothing in this Act or in any by-law made hereunder shall extend to prohibit, or restrict the driving of milch cows, cattle in teams, or working cattle, in or through either of the municipalities hereinafter mentioned.

5. (1) The Municipal Council of East Maitland and the Municipal Council of West Maitland may make by-laws for the purpose of regulating within the boundaries of their respective municipalities the passage of cattle intended for sale, slaughter, shipment, or conveyance by rail.

(2) Such by-laws may prescribe penalties not exceeding twenty shillings for every head of cattle driven in contravention thereof, and may provide for the due enforcement and application of such penalties.

(3) All such by-laws shall be subject to the conditions and other provisions relative to by-laws contained in the Municipalities Act, 1897.
