An Act to amend the Friendly Societies (Further Amendment) Act, 1901. [*5th December, 1903.*]

FRIENDLY SOCIETIES
(AMENDING).
—

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the “Friendly Societies (Amending) Act, 1903.” Short title.

2. Paragraph (a) of subsection one of section two of the Friendly Societies (Further Amendment) Act, 1901, is repealed, and the following is substituted in its place:— Amendment of section 2 (1) of Act of 1901.

- “(a) That separate and distinct accounts shall be kept of the contributions to and payments from the funds payable in case of sickness or death respectively by and to—
- (i) the members of the society before the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and three; and
 - (ii) the members joining the society after such date.”
