An Act to amend the Broken Hill and Umber-
umberka Water Supply Act, 1906; and for
other purposes. [17th December, 1907.]

BROKEN HILL AND
UMBERUMBERKA
WATER SUPPLY
(AMENDMENT).

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the “Broken Hill and Umber-
umberka Water Supply (Amendment) Act, 1907,” and shall be read
with the Broken Hill and Umberumberka Water Supply Act, 1906,
hereinafter called the Principal Act.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in section eighteen of
the Principal Act, the number of members of the trust to be appointed
by the council shall be two, and the number of members to be
appointed by the mining companies shall be four.

3. Section thirty-two of the Principal Act is hereby repealed
and the following section substituted in lieu thereof:—“The member
appointed by the Governor shall be deemed to have been appointed
for three years.”

4. The provisions of the Principal Act with regard to the filling
up of vacancies in the trust shall apply to the appointment of the
additional member to be by this Act appointed by the mining
companies.
