## Act No. 20, 1909.

An Act to sanction the erection of a Hospital MORISSET HOSPITAL  
FOR INSANE.  
for the Insane at Morisset; and for purposes  
consequent thereupon or incidental thereto.  
[16th December, 1909.]

**W**HEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the Public Preamble.  
Works Act, 1900, the Legislative Assembly did, by resolution,  
declare that it was expedient to carry out a certain work, namely, the  
erection of a Hospital for the Insane at Morisset: And whereas, on  
the passing of the said resolution, a statutory duty was by the said  
Act imposed on the Secretary for Public Works to introduce a Bill  
into the said Assembly to sanction the carrying out of the said work:  
Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and  
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative  
Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the  
authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the “Morisset Hospital for Insane Short title.  
Act, 1909.”

2. The works described in the Schedule to this Act are hereby Work sanctioned.  
sanctioned, and the carrying out of the same by the Secretary for  
Public Works, or the member of the Executive Council for the time  
being performing the duties of the said Secretary, is hereby authorised,  
and for that purpose he shall be, and shall have the powers and duties  
of, a Constructing Authority within the meaning of the Public Works  
Act, 1900.

3. The plan of the works is the plan marked “Hospital Plan of work.  
for Insane, Morisset,” signed by the Secretary for Public Works, and  
countersigned by the Government Architect, and deposited in the  
public office of the said Secretary.

4. The cost of carrying out such of the works in the said Cost, and how  
defrayed.  
Schedule as have not yet been constructed, estimated at one hundred  
and twenty-six thousand four hundred pounds, may be defrayed from  
such Loan Votes as are now or may hereafter be applicable to that  
purpose, or from appropriations of the Public Works Fund, or partly  
from such votes and partly from the said appropriations, and shall  
not under any circumstances exceed the estimated cost by more than  
ten per centum.
