### An Act to sanction the completion of the erection of a Library within the grounds of the Uni- versity of Sydney; and for other purposes. [22nd December, 1910.]

#### Preamble.

WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of the Public Works Act, 1900, the Legislative Assembly did, by resolution, declare that it was expedient to carry out a certain work, namely, the completion of the erection of a Library within the grounds of the University of Sydney in connection with that University: And whereas, on the passing of the said resolution, a statutory duty was by the said Act imposed on the Secretary for Public Works to introduce a Bill into the said Assembly to sanction the carrying out of the said work: Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

#### Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "University of Sydney (Fisher Library Compiection) Act, 1910."

#### Work sanctioned.

2. The carrying out of the said work (more particularly described in the Schedule to this Act) is hereby sanctioned; and the Secretary for Public Works, or the member of the Executive Council for the time

time being performing the duties of the said Secretary, is hereby authorised to undertake and carry out the said work, subject to the provisions of this Act, and for that purpose shall be, and shall have the powers and duties of, a Constructing Authority within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1900.

**3.** The plan of the said work is the plan marked "Fisher <sup>Plan of work.</sup> Library Completion," signed by the Secretary for Public Works and countersigned by the Government Architect, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary.

**4.** The cost of the said work, estimated at thirty-two thousand <sup>Cost, and how to be defrayed.</sup> and sixty-four pounds, may be defrayed from the Public Works Fund, but shall not under any circumstances exceed the estimated cost by more than ten per centum.

## SCHEDULE.

THE erection of buildings in extension of the Fisher Library, providing:—

Entrance halls and staircases.

Approaches to Nicholson Museum and Fisher Library.

Ground floor:—

Additional accommodation for curator.

Common rooms for lady students.

Common room for professors.

Continuation of Cloister.

First floor:—

Rooms for Librarian, rare books, periodicals, and learned societies.

Common room and study rooms for staff.

Second floor:—

Two spare rooms not yet apportioned.

(Subject to such alterations as may be deemed necessary during the progress of the work.)
