An Act to amend the Friendly Societies (Amendment) Act, 1906. [7th January, 1913.]

FRIENDLY
SOCIETIES
(AMENDMENT).

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the “Friendly Societies (Amendment) Act, 1912.” Short title.

2. Section six, subsection one, of the Friendly Societies (Amendment) Act, 1906, is amended by inserting at the commencement of the subsection the words “Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding section” Amendment of s. 6 of the 1906 Act.

3. Section seven of the same Act is amended by inserting after the word “registrar” where it first occurs in that section, the words “may authorise surplus moneys belonging to any one fund or benefit to be used in any manner for the purposes of any other fund or benefit and” Amendment of s. 7.
