

## SYDNEY CORPORATION (AMENDMENT) ACT.

---

Act No. 37, 1915.

An Act to amend the Sydney Corporation Act, George V,  
1902, in respect to the hours of voting. No. 37.  
[Assented to, 24th November, 1915.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty,  
by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative  
Council and Legislative Assembly of New South  
Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of  
the same, as follows:—

**1.** This Act may be cited as the "Sydney Corporation (Amendment) Act, 1915." Short title.

**2.** Section thirty-three of the Sydney Corporation Act, 1902, is amended— Amendment of s. 33.

(a) by the omission of the words "six o'clock in Hours of the afternoon" and the insertion in lieu thereof voting, of the words "half-past seven o'clock in the evening"; and (b)

(b) by the addition of the following proviso :—  
“ Provided that if at the last mentioned hour any citizens are in the polling-booth and desire to vote, the votes of such citizens shall be taken, and for that purpose the voting shall not close until such citizens have voted.”
