

INCOME TAX ACT.

Act No. 1, 1922.

An Act to provide for an increase of income tax; George V, and for this purpose to amend the Income Tax Act, 1911, and certain other Acts. [Assented to, 28th April, 1922.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Income Tax Act, Short title. 1922."

2. The amount in the pound which constitutes the increase of income tax imposed on any taxable income by the Income Tax Act, 1911, as amended by the Income Tax (Amendment) Act, 1912, the Income Tax (Amendment) Act, 1914, and the Income Tax (Amendment) Act, 1920, is hereby, with respect to the income tax payable in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, increased by the sum of sixpence.
