

BIRDS AND ANIMALS PROTECTION (AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 37, 1922.

George V, An Act to amend the Birds and Animals Protection No. 37. Act, 1918, in certain respects. [Assented to, 28th November, 1922.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title. **1.** This Act may be cited as the “Birds and Animals Protection (Amendment) Act, 1922,” and shall be construed with the Birds and Animals Protection Act, 1918 (hereinafter called the Principal Act).

2. Section seventeen of the Principal Act is repealed **George V,**
and the following new section is substituted therefor:— **No. 37.**

17. (1) All protected birds and animals until taken or killed in accordance with the provisions of this Act shall be deemed to be the property of the Crown.

(2) Nothing in this Act shall prevent any person from keeping in confinement or in a domesticated state any protected bird or animal which has been taken in accordance with the provisions of this Act.
