

BIRDS AND ANIMALS PRO- TECTION (AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 37, 1922.

George V, **An Act to amend the Birds and Animals Protection
No. 37.** Act, 1918, in certain respects. [Assented to,
28th November, 1922.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty,
by and with the advice and consent of the Legis-
lative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South
Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of
the same, as follows:—

Short title. **1.** This Act may be cited as the “Birds and Animals
Protection (Amendment) Act, 1922,” and shall be
construed with the Birds and Animals Protection Act,
1918 (hereinafter called the Principal Act).
