

BLACKHEATH WATER SUPPLY ACT.

Act No. 39, 1923.

George V, No. 39. **An Act** to sanction the construction of works of water supply for the Municipality of Blackheath. [Assented to, 21st December, 1923.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows : —

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the “Blackheath Water Supply Act, 1923.”

2.

2. The carrying out of the works described in the Schedule to this Act is hereby sanctioned, and the Secretary for Public Works is empowered to carry out the said works. George V,

3. The cost of carrying out the said works, exclusive of land resumptions, is estimated at forty-five thousand three hundred pounds, and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum. Cost.

4. The plan of the works is the plan marked "Blackheath Water Supply," signed by the Secretary for Public Works, and countersigned by the Chief Engineer for Water Supply and Sewerage, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary. The plan.

SCHEDULE.

THE scheme comprises :—

- (1) A pumping station adjacent to Adams Creek Reservoir with pumping machinery connected with that reservoir.
- (2) A rising main to Blackheath.
- (3) A service reservoir at Blackheath.
- (4) Service mains and reticulation.
- (5) A rising main to connect with Medlow Water Supply.
- (6) Electric transmission lines, including crossings over public and private roads.
- (7) Telephone and electric indicator lines.
- (8) Works connected therewith.

The whole to be subject to such deviations or modifications as may be deemed desirable by the Constructing Authority.
