

LEE WHARF EXTENSION ACT.

Act No. 44, 1923.

AN Act to sanction the extension of Lee Wharf at Newcastle; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 21st December, 1923.] George V,
No. 44.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Lee Wharf Extension Act, 1923." Short title.

2. The carrying out of the work described in the Schedule to this Act is hereby sanctioned, and the Secretary for Public Works is empowered to carry out the same. Work
sanctioned.

3. The plan of the said work is the plan marked "Newcastle Harbour Improvements, Lee Wharf Extension," signed by the Secretary for Public Works, and countersigned by the Chief Engineer for Harbours and Drainage, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary. The plan.

4. The cost of carrying out the said work (exclusive of land resumptions) is estimated at forty-four thousand four hundred pounds, and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum. Cost.

SCHEDULE.

THE construction of a wharf of timber commencing at the western end of the existing Lee Wharf, city of Newcastle, extending thence a distance of 540 feet in a westerly direction, together with the erection of a goods shed and awning, and all necessary filling behind wharf, drainage and railway connections as indicated in red, and marked "A" on deposited plan, subject to such modifications as may be considered desirable by the Constructing Authority.
