

MARRIAGE (AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 12, 1924.

An Act to amend the Marriage Act of 1899, in certain respects. [Assented to, 3rd October, 1924.] George V,
No. 12.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the “Marriage (Amendment) Act, 1924,” and shall be read with the Marriage Act, 1899, herein referred to as the Principal Act. Short title.

2. The Principal Act is amended by omitting all the words in the Second Schedule after the word “married” when it first occurs and by inserting in lieu thereof the words “and that the place where Mary Edwards ordinarily resides is at (*state usual place of residence*).” Amendment
