

ROYAL COMMISSIONS  
(MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF  
SYDNEY) ACT.

Act No. 18, 1924.

An Act to extend the powers of a certain Royal Commissioner; to provide for the procedure before such commissioner; to extend the provisions of the Royal Commissions Act, 1923; and for purposes connected therewith.  
[Assented to, 24th October, 1924.]

WHEREAS by Letters Patent issued under the Preamble, Great Seal dated the twenty-second day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, Sydney Ernest Lamb, one of His Majesty's Counsel, was authorised and appointed to make the inquiry therein mentioned

**George V,** mentioned: And whereas it is desirable to extend the powers of the said commissioner and to make further provision for the procedure in such inquiry, and to extend the provisions of the Royal Commissions Act, 1923: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

**Short title.**

**1.** This Act may be cited as the "Royal Commissions (Municipal Council of Sydney) Act, 1924."

**Powers of  
commiss-  
sioner.**

**2.** (1) For the purposes of the inquiry under the said Letters Patent, and any future extension of the terms or the scope of the same, the said commissioner shall have the same powers rights and privileges as if he were a judge of the Supreme Court to whom the Governor had by Letters Patent under the Great Seal issued a Royal Commission within the meaning of the Royal Commissions Act, 1923, to make the inquiry as the sole commissioner, and the following provisions of that Act, that is to say, section sixteen, subsections one, two, and three of section seventeen, and section eighteen, shall extend to the said commissioner and apply to and with respect to the inquiry, notwithstanding any provisions of that Act to the contrary.

(2) The powers, rights, and privileges conferred by this Act on the said commissioner shall be in addition to any powers, rights, and privileges conferred on him by the said or any other Letters Patent or by the Royal Commissions Act, 1923.
