

NEWCASTLE WHARFAGE (MEREWETHER-STREET) ACT.

Act No. 53, 1924.

George V, An Act to sanction the construction of a wharf at
No. 53. Merewether-street, Newcastle ; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 23rd December, 1924.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

Short title. **1.** This Act may be cited as the “ Newcastle Wharfage (Merewether-street) Act, 1924.”

2. The carrying out of the work described in the Schedule to this Act is hereby sanctioned, and the Secretary for Public Works is empowered to carry out the same. **George V,**

Work sanctioned.

3. The plan of the said work is the plan marked "Newcastle Harbour Improvements," signed by the Secretary for Public Works and countersigned by the Chief Engineer for Harbours and Drainage, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary. The plan.

4. The cost of carrying out the said work is estimated at twenty-four thousand five hundred pounds, and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum. Cost.

SCHEDULE.

THE construction of a timber wharf on piles commencing at a point on the prolongation of the eastern side of Merewether-street, and extending in an easterly direction for a distance of 500 feet towards the Newcastle and Hunter River Company's wharf, and the deepening of the water along the face of the wharf to 30 feet; subject to such deviations and modifications as the Constructing Authority may think desirable.
