

TAREE WATER SUPPLY ACT.

Act No. 59, 1924.

George V, No. 59. An Act to sanction the construction of certain works of water supply for the Municipality of Taree; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 23rd December, 1924.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

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| Short title. | 1. This Act may be cited as the "Taree Water Supply Act, 1924." |
| Works sanctioned. | 2. The carrying out of the works described in the Schedule to this Act is hereby sanctioned, and the Secretary for Public Works is empowered to carry out the said works. |
| Cost. | 3. The cost of carrying out the said works, exclusive of land resumptions, is estimated at seventy-eight thousand pounds, and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum. |
| The plan. | 4. The plan of the works is the plan marked "Taree Water Supply Proposal—Schedule Plan," signed by the Secretary for Public Works and countersigned by the Chief Engineer for Water Supply and Sewerage, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary. |

1. A pumping station adjacent to Dingo Creek, with pumping machinery connected with that creek, and approach to pumping station.
2. A rising main.
3. Settling tanks near Wingham.
4. A gravitation main to Taree.
5. A service reservoir at Taree.
6. Service main and reticulation.
7. Telephone and electric indicator lines.
8. Works connected therewith.

The whole to be subject to such deviations or modifications as may be deemed desirable by the Constructing Authority.
