

INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION (SUSPENSION OF LIVING WAGE DECLARATION) ACT.

No. 27, 1929. An Act to suspend the power of the Industrial Commission of New South Wales to declare the living wages for adult male and adult female employees; to amend the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith.
[Assented to, 31st October, 1929.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title. **1.** This Act may be cited as the "Industrial Arbitration (Suspension of Living Wage Declaration) Act, 1929," and shall be read and construed with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts.

2. The Industrial Commission of New South Wales shall not after the commencement of this Act declare the living wages for adult male and adult female employees in New South Wales in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts or of the Industrial Arbitration (Living Wage Declaration) Act, 1927, until Parliament makes further provision in that behalf.

No living wage to be declared until further provision made by Parliament.
