

STOCKTON SEWERAGE ACT.

Act No. 47, 1932.

An Act to sanction the construction of works of sewerage for the town of Stockton; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 21st December, 1932.] George V,

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the “Stockton Sewerage Act, 1932.” short title.

2. (1) The carrying out of the works described in the Schedule to this Act is hereby sanctioned, and the Minister for Public Works is empowered to carry out the said works. Works

(2) The plan of the said works is the plan marked “Stockton Sewerage,” signed by the Minister for Public Works, and countersigned by the Chief Engineer for Water Supply and Sewerage, and deposited in the office of the said Minister. The plan,

Cost.

(3) The cost of carrying out the said works, exclusive of land resumptions, is estimated at one hundred and fifteen thousand pounds, and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum.

SCHEDULE.

WORKS of sewerage for the town of Stockton comprising the construction of main sewers, reticulation sewers, and ventilation, pumping stations and machinery, cast-iron rising mains and treatment works, subject to such deviations and modifications as may be deemed necessary by the Minister.
