

NATIONAL LIBRARY (AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 6, 1934.

An Act to make further provision regarding the completion of the National Library and to sanction such completion in accordance with certain amended plans; to amend the National Library Act, 1905, and the National Library Act, 1924; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 10th July, 1934.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the “National Library (Amendment) Act, 1934.” Short title.

2. (1) The work sanctioned by the National Library Act, 1924, may be carried out not in accordance with the plans referred to in section three of the National Library Act, 1924, but in accordance with plans marked “Plans of the Completion of the National Library, 1934,” numbered B697 to B702, respectively signed by the Secretary for Public Works and countersigned by the Government Architect, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary. Plans.

(2) The substitution in such plans of a rectangular reading room with a ridged roof for an octagonal reading room with a dome roof over the same, and of front steps rectangular in form for steps round in form is expressly sanctioned.

(3) The work may be carried out in accordance with the plans numbered B697 to B702 subject to such minor alterations and modifications as to the Secretary for Public Works shall seem expedient and proper.

(4) The estimated cost of carrying out the said work as stated in section four of the National Library Act, 1924, shall not be increased by reason of the work being carried out in accordance with the plans numbered B697 to B702.
