

## MAITLAND DISTRICT SEWERAGE ACT.

---

### Act No. 17, 1935.

An Act to sanction the construction of works of sewerage for the towns of West Maitland and East Maitland and adjacent districts; to amend the Public Works Act, 1912; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 25th March, 1935.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

**1.** This Act may be cited as the “ Maitland District Sewerage Act, 1935.”

**2.** (1) The carrying out of the works described in the Schedule is hereby sanctioned and the Minister for Public Works is empowered to carry out the said works.

(2) The provisions of sections thirty-four, thirty-five, thirty-six and thirty-seven of the Public Works Act, 1912, shall not apply to the said works, but, subject as aforesaid, the works shall be carried out under the provisions of that Act.

(3) The plan of the said works is the plan marked “ Maitland District Sewerage ” signed by the Minister for Public Works and countersigned by the Chief Engineer for Public Works, and deposited in the office of the said Minister.

(4) The cost of carrying out the said works, exclusive of land resumptions, is estimated at three hundred and seventy thousand pounds, and such estimated cost shall not under any circumstances be exceeded by more than ten per centum.

**SCHEDULE.**

WORKS of sewerage for the Municipalities of West Maitland and East Maitland and for the suburb of Lorn in Bolwarra Shire, comprising the construction of main sewers, reticulation sewers, ventilation, pumping stations with machinery, rising sewers, treatment works and all works necessary and incidental thereto.

Subject to such deviations and modifications as may be deemed necessary by the Minister.
