

TRANSPORT (AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 46, 1943.

An Act to make provision for the granting, to officers employed in the transport services, of holiday passes authorising free travel on the Government Railways of New South Wales; for this purpose to amend the Transport Act, 1930-1943, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 21st December, 1943.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Transport (Amendment) Act, 1943."

(2) This Act shall commence upon the day next following the date of the termination of the present war between His Majesty and Germany and her allies.

2. The Transport Act, 1930-1943, is amended by inserting next after section one hundred and twenty-three the following new section:—

Holiday
passes.

123A. (1) Every officer of any branch of the transport services shall be entitled to one holiday pass each year which shall authorise free travel on the Government Railways of New South Wales and shall, in the case of each such officer, be available for a period not exceeding the period of the annual leave due to him.

Every such holiday pass shall be issued upon the like terms and subject to the like conditions and restrictions as apply from time to time to holiday passes issued by The Commissioner for Railways to officers of that Commissioner.

(2) The Commissioner for Railways is hereby authorised to issue all such passes as are referred to in subsection one of this section.

(3) The Commissioner for Road Transport and Tramways shall pay to The Commissioner for Railways such amount as may be agreed upon in respect of such passes.
