

DENTISTS (AMENDMENT) ACT.

No. 2, 1946. **An Act to amend paragraph (h) of subsection two of section eight of the Dentists Act, 1934. [Assented to, 7th January, 1946.]**

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

and citation. **1.** (1) This Act may be cited as the “Dentists (Amendment) Act, 1945.”

(2) The Dentists Act, 1934, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Dentists Act, 1934-1945.

misconduct.) **2.** The Dentists Act, 1934, is amended by omitting from paragraph (h) of subsection two of section eight, all words following the word “corporation” and by inserting in lieu thereof the words—

“but does not include—

- (i) the Crown;
- (ii) a public hospital or charitable or philanthropic institution;
- (iii) a society registered under the Friendly Societies Act, 1912, or any amendment thereof;
- (iv) any body or corporation which upon application made for the purpose has been approved by the Board.

The approval of the Board referred to in subparagraph No. 2, 1946.
(iv) of this paragraph shall not be granted unless the Board is satisfied that the interests of the public generally or of any section of the public, other than registered dentists, warrant the granting of such approval. Any such approval may be granted subject to any terms and conditions the Board may think fit to impose, and may be revoked by the Board for any cause which it deems reasonable."
