

LOCAL GOVERNMENT (FURTHER AMENDMENT) ACT.

An Act to authorise local government authorities to expend moneys from their funds upon the forthcoming Royal visit; for this purpose to amend the Local Government Act, 1919, and the Gas and Electricity Act, 1935-1949; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 5th December, 1951.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Local Government (Further Amendment) Act, 1951".

(2) This Act shall be read and construed with the Local Government Act, 1919, as amended by subsequent Acts.
