

MEAT INDUSTRY (AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 27, 1966.

An Act to provide for the extension of the term of Elizabeth II,
No. 27, 1966 office of the present representative on the Metropolitan Meat Industry Board of persons employed in the meat industry; for this purpose to amend the Meat Industry Act, 1915-1965; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 13th April, 1966.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Meat Industry (Amendment) Act, 1966". Short title.

2. Notwithstanding any provision of the Meat Industry Act, 1915, as amended by subsequent Acts, the Governor Extension of William John Carter's term of office as a member of the Board. may appoint William John Carter, Esquire, to hold office under section eight of that Act, as so amended, as the member of the Metropolitan Meat Industry Board representative of persons employed in the meat industry, for one or more periods not exceeding two years in the aggregate, after he has attained the age of sixty-five years.

For the purposes of this section the Meat Industry Act, 1915, as amended by subsequent Acts, shall be deemed to be amended by omitting from paragraph (b) of subsection one of section 8A the words "sixty-five years" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "sixty-seven years".
