Act No. 19, 1969.

An Act relating to the sale of fireworks; for this purpose to amend the Explosives Act, 1905–1968; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 2nd April, 1969.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title
and citation.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Explosives (Amendment) Act, 1969".

(2) The Explosives Act, 1905, as subsequently amended and as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Explosives Act, 1905–1969.

25A. The Governor may make regulations prohibiting Governor
or regulating the sale, or the exposing for sale, by retail, ^{may limit} _{sale of} fireworks.
of fireworks of such classes or descriptions as are specified in the regulations except on such days or in such circumstances as are specified therein.

If any fireworks are sold or exposed for sale in contravention of any such regulations—

- (a) the person selling or exposing for sale the same shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars; and
- (b) all or any part of the same may be forfeited while in the possession, control or custody of that person.
