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Act No. 159, 1978.

An Act to amend section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1926, to include treatment by a dental prosthodontist within the definition of "Medical treatment" for the purposes of that section. [Assented to, 29th December, 1978.]

Workers' Compensation (Dental Technicians) Amendment.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

Short title. **1.** This Act may be cited as the "Workers' Compensation (Dental Technicians) Amendment Act, 1978".

Commencement. **2.** (1) This section and section 1 shall commence on the date of assent to this Act.

(2) Except as provided in subsection (1), this Act shall commence on the day appointed and notified under section 2 (2) of the Dental Technicians Registration (Amendment) Act, 1978.

Amendment of Act No. 15, 1926.

Sec. 10.
(Medical and hospital treatment, etc.)

3. The Workers' Compensation Act, 1926, is amended—

(a) by inserting after the definition of "Approved" in section 10 (2) the following definition :—

"Dental prosthodontist" has the meaning ascribed thereto by section 5 (1) of the Dental Technicians Registration Act, 1975.

(b) by inserting in paragraph (a) of the definition of "Medical treatment" in section 10 (2) after the word "dentist," the words "a dental prosthodontist,".
