**Act No. 101, 1980.**

An Act to amend the Macquarie University Act, 1964, with respect to the delegation of powers and functions of the Council of the University; and for certain other purposes. [Assented to, 1st May, 1980.]

**BE** it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

**Short title.** **1.** This Act may be cited as the "Macquarie University (Amendment) Act, 1980".

**Amendment of Act No. 29, 1964.** **3.** The Macquarie University Act, 1964, is amended in the manner set forth in Schedules 1 and 2.

**Savings provision.** **4.** Any delegation made under section 22 of the Macquarie University Act, 1964, as in force immediately before the commencement of this Act, shall be deemed to have been made under that section, as amended by this Act.

AMENDMENTS TO THE MACQUARIE UNIVERSITY ACT, 1964.

(1) Section 3, definitions of "Academic Senate" and "by-laws"—

Omit the definition of "By-laws", insert instead :—

"Academic Senate" means the Academic Senate of the University constituted in accordance with the by-laws;

"by-laws" means the by-laws made under this Act;

(2) Section 22 (1)—

Omit the subsection, insert instead :—

(1) The Council may, in relation to any matter or class of matters, or in relation to any activity or function of the University, by resolution, delegate any or all of its powers or functions under this Act (except this power of delegation and its powers in relation to the making of by-laws) to—

- (a) any member of the Council;
- (b) any committee of the Council;
- (c) the Academic Senate;
- (d) any committee of the Academic Senate; or
- (e) any officer or officers of the University.

(3) Section 23 (1) (f), (f1)—

Omit section 23 (1) (f), insert instead :—

(f) the constitution, powers and functions of a body to be called the Academic Senate or of committees of the Council or Academic Senate;

(f1) the convening and holding of meetings of, and the conduct of proceedings of, the Academic Senate or of any committee of the Council or Academic Senate;

## (4) Section 23A—

After section 23, insert :—

Membership  
of Academic  
Senate or  
committees.

23A. Without limiting the generality of section 23 (1) (f)—

- (a) the Academic Senate may, if the by-laws so provide, be constituted so as to include among its members, persons who are not members of the Council; and
- (b) a committee of the Council or Academic Senate may, if the by-laws so provide, be constituted so as to include among its members, persons who are not members of the Council or Academic Senate.

## (5) Section 31 (1)—

Omit the subsection, insert instead :—

- (1) The Council shall allow such persons as are—
  - (a) teachers in schools established under the Public Instruction Act of 1880 or members of the Public Service of New South Wales approved by the Minister;

- (b) qualified in such manner as may be prescribed by the by-laws to be enrolled as students of the University;
- (c) selected by the University for admission to the University; and
- (d) not otherwise excluded from the University,  
to attend University lectures, or to enrol as external students, for the purpose of proceeding to a first degree and to receive tuition for the period required for admission to that degree without payment of lecture, class or tuition fees.

Omit the proviso.

## (3) Section 10 (11)—

Omit “three years”, insert instead “3 years”.

## (4) Section 12 (c)—

Omit “three consecutive meetings”, insert instead “3 consecutive meetings”.

## (5) (a) Section 15 (1)—

Omit “and the first Chancellor shall be elected by the persons referred to in subsections (2) to (9), both inclusive, of section 10, and subsequent Chancellors”, insert instead “who”.

## (b) Section 15 (2)—

Omit “three years”, insert instead “3 years”.

## (6) Section 16 (2)—

Omit “one year”, insert instead “1 year”.

## (7) Section 21 (1) (g), proviso—

Omit “twenty-one years”, insert instead “21 years”.

## (8) Section 24 (1), (2)—

Omit “the first day of January” wherever occurring, insert instead “1st January”.
