Public Health (COVID-19 Restrictions on Gathering and Movement) Order (No 7) Amendment (No 4) Order 2020

Explanatory note

The object of this Order is to amend the *Public Health (COVID-19 Restrictions on Gathering and Movement) Order (No 7) 2020*—

- (a) to reduce the maximum number of persons who may participate in an outdoor public gathering in Greater Sydney, and
- (b) to require a person entering a hospitality venue or hairdressing salon to electronically register the person's contact details with Service NSW, and
- (c) to remove spent provisions.

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1 Name of Order

This Order is the *Public Health (COVID-19 Restrictions on Gathering and Movement) Order (No 7) Amendment (No 4) Order 2020*.

2 Commencement

- (1) This Order commences at the beginning of 29 December 2020 except as provided by subclause (2).
- (2) Schedule 1[5] commences at 12 noon on 1 January 2021.

Schedule 1 Amendment of Public Health (COVID-19 Restrictions on Gathering and Movement) Order (No 7) 2020

- [1] **Clause 15 Directions of Minister about number of persons allowed on residential premises**
Omit clause 15(6) and (7).
- [2] **Clause 15(8), definition of “Christmas period”**
Omit the definition.
- [3] **Clause 30 Directions of Minister about controlled outdoor public gatherings**
Insert after clause 30(6)—
(7) For an outdoor public gathering in Greater Sydney, the reference in subclause (1) to 100 persons is taken to be a reference to 50 persons.
- [4] **Clause 31 Direction of Minister about holiday homes and short-term rentals**
Omit clause 31(2A).
- [5] **Clause 36 Directions of Minister concerning persons providing contact details**
Insert after clause 36(3)(a)—
(a1) for a person entering a hospitality venue or a hairdressing salon—by electronically registering the person’s contact details with Service NSW by means of a mobile phone or other device at the time the person enters the premises,
