The Bush Fires (General) Regulations are amended by inserting after Regulation 18 the following Regulation:

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Bush Fires Act 1949 provides for certain powers and duties to be exercised by fire patrol officers. Section 42 provides that a fire patrol officer is a person who for the time being holds an office which is specified in the Regulations as being an office by virtue of which the person is a fire patrol officer. The object of this Regulation is to specify such offices.
