**NATIONAL PARKS AND WILDLIFE ACT 1974—
NOTIFICATION**

NEW SOUTH WALES



[Published in Gazette No. 30 of 28 February 1992]

Pursuant to Section 92A* of the National Parks and Wildlife Act, 1974, the following revised (interim) Schedule 12 has been prepared by the Scientific Committee.

In deciding whether to place a species of fauna in Part 1 (Threatened) in accordance with the provisions of Section 92A (5) the following criteria were used:

- (a) whether the population of a species has been reduced to a critical level;
- (b) whether habitat of a species has been drastically reduced or modified;
- (c) whether a species may be in danger of extinction;
- (d) whether a species may now be considered extinct but has been seen in the wild in the last 50 years.

In deciding whether to place a species of fauna in Part 2 (Vulnerable and Rare) in accordance with the provisions of Section 92A (6), the following criteria were used:

- (a) whether the population of a species is decreasing because of over-exploitation, extensive destruction of habitat or other environmental disturbance;

* Section 92A (9) reads as follows:

(9) On publication of the revised (interim) Schedule 12 in the Gazette, the existing Schedule 12 is omitted and replaced with the revised (interim) Schedule 12.

- (b) whether the population of a species has been seriously depleted and its ultimate security has not yet been assured;
- (c) whether the population of a species is still abundant but is under threat from severe adverse factors throughout its range;
- (d) whether a species has a small population contained in restricted areas or habitats or thinly scattered over a more extensive area.

(Species presumed to be extinct, i.e. not seen in the wild in the last 50 years, have been marked with an asterisk).

A statement setting out the reasons for the Scientific Committee's decisions in relation to the revision of Schedule 12 and any recommendation to add species or omit species from Schedule 12 is available for inspection and purchase from the National Parks and Wildlife Service Head Office, 43 Bridge Street, Hurstville between 9 am and 5 pm Monday to Friday.
