1. The object of the amendment contained in paragraph 2 is to assign appeals to the Court under section 67 of the Nurses Act 1991, other than appeals to the Court of Appeal, to the Administrative Law Division.
2. The object of the amendment contained in paragraph 3 is to assign appeals to the Court under section 52 of the Chiropractors and Osteopaths Act 1991, other than appeals to the Court of Appeal, to the Administrative Law Division.
