EXPLANATORY NOTE

The object of this Proclamation is to commence the amendments to the Cattle Compensation Act 1951 contained in the Statute Law (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1992. The amendments relate to the basis on which the market value of a carcass is calculated, the approval of the form of applications for compensation and to other matters. The Cattle Compensation Regulations also are repealed on the commencement of the amendments.
