EXPLANATORY NOTE

The object of this Proclamation is to commence the amendments to the Legal Profession Act 1987 contained in the Statute Law (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1992. The amendments relate to the continuation of hearings by the Legal Profession Standards Board and the Legal Profession Disciplinary Tribunal if vacancies in membership occur before hearings are completed. The amendments also provide for the remuneration of members of legal profession disciplinary bodies to be determined by the Law Society Council (in consultation with the Bar Council) instead of by the Attorney General.
